Annual dues remained at \$75.00 per year now due in June of each calendar year.

We also continued to support *"Hygiene Baskets"*, which is a project that was introduced two bienniums ago by then president Sandy Deforno. A Basket filled with personal items are placed in faculty restrooms throughout the Armstrong School District, including the Administration Building. Our members donate products and/or cash to fill the much used baskets.

We also continue to award *Grant-In-Aid Scholarships* to Early year Educators. Melissa Hoener, Jamie Myers, Kayla Wolfe, Lauren Walters, Sarah Coleman and Jessica McCauley where recipients in this biennium. Our newest project was <u>"Blessings in a Backpack"</u>. We kicked off this initiative with an introduction from our local representative, Molly Atwood. Alpha Theta members have donated needed food items, monetary gifts as well as their time to help to pack bags that are sent home with students in need.

I hope to see this project continue as an Alpha Theta project for years to come.

We had a one-time project making *"Cards for Kids"*. We used stamping items and created cards to send to children's hospital, ACMH and any other requested location. It was later learned that the hospitals would not accept the donations due to covid so the cards were donated to classroom teachers.

For several months we individually saved empty and clean prescription pill bottles at the request of Lynn Sibley. The number of bottles collected was overwhelming and they would be shipped overseas where such bottles are not available. While this was a on-time project, it will be helpful to many.

Lynn Sibley applied and was granted an Enrichment Grant. She will be travelling in the U.S. and abroad as a Mission Ambassador.

We initiated six new members in two separate ceremonies: Trisha Foust, Lorelei Smathers, Brittany Weaver, Patricia Goldinger, Carolyn Smith, and Kayla Wolfe are now valuable DKG members.

For personal reasons, Laurel Glover resigned as 2<sup>nd</sup> Vice President. Connie Marr continued to fill the obligation of this job. Also resigning for personal reasons, Kim Miller stepped down as Recording Secretary, which led to a larger change in leadership. Rhonda Reed became Recording Secretary and Carolyn Smith was appointed as Treasurer.

Alpha Theta celebrated its **65**<sup>th</sup> **Birthday.** January 22, 1955, the Alpha Theta Chapter became a charter organization. We celebrated on January 22, 2020, with a social dinner at the local Crafthouse restaurant to honor the creation of our chapter.

We sadly lost member Carolyn Gallaher on May 4th, 2019. Carolyn was a valued member of Alpha Theta and served as President 1984-1986. A rose was placed in her coffin and a DKG memorial was held at the August meeting. She was also memorialized at the state convention in June. Her soft spoken, friendly and supportive personality is missed by all.
